

**Cambodian Village Fund
Articles of Organization and Bylaws
Adopted August 15, 2006**

Date Established

August 15, 2006

Term of Fund

The fund will continue indefinitely or until terminated by the Co-Directors.

Purpose of Organization

The Cambodian Village Fund is a charity solely for the purpose of collecting money to be disbursed to families in a village in Cambodia. The funds will be used to enhance the education, and educational opportunities, of the families. The Cambodian Village Fund will NOT:

- Participate in political campaigns
- Use funds to compensate any officers or board members of the Fund
- Engage in legislative activities
- Engage in illegal activities

Operation of the Organization

Funds will be collected in the form of cash, checks and payments through PayPal. All funds will be deposited in one of more bank accounts until the funds are distributed to the families in the Cambodian village.

How Funds Will Be Distributed

Funds will be distributed either in the form of cash payments or goods purchased from the contributions.

Administrative Costs

Contributions to the Fund may be used for certain administrative costs, including, but not limited to, PayPal expenses and bank fees. No contributions will be used for travel or salaries.

Compensation of Directors and Officers

The directors and officers of the Fund will receive no compensation or salary for their activities related to the fund.

Organizational Structure

The Cambodian Village Fund is under the direction of two Co-Directors, to be selected by the founders, William J. Bamberger and Nancy J. Bamberger.

Accounting

The Co-Directors of the Cambodian Village Fund will establish bank accounts under the name "Cambodian Village Fund" and maintain complete records of all contributions to the fund, and all expenditures by the fund.

Dissolution Provision


In case the Cambodian Village Fund is dissolved, all remaining assets will be used exclusively for tax exempt purposes. Remaining assets will be used to purchase goods for a Cambodian Village, or, if this is not possible, donated to the Salvation Army.
